**Minutes of the Monthly Meeting of the District Education Officers (SE)
held on 13.01.2009**

1.0 A meeting of all DEOS (SE) in the State of Punjab was held in the office of Director General School Education on 13.01.2009 to review the issues relating to Secondary Education. Mr. Krishan Kumar, Director General School Education chaired the meeting.

2.0 The list of officers who attended the meeting is at **Annexure A**.

3.0 **Action Taken Report by the DEOs on the previous meeting / meetings:**

The following observations are made on the Action Taken Report (ATR) by the DEOs in their respective districts on the decisions taken in the previous meeting-

1. Inspection reports of the surprise checking of the schools have not been received from the DEOs of the districts of Jalandhar and Mohali.

4.0 Following discussions / decisions were taken in the meeting.

4.1 Number of Schools visited:

a. It was noted that all DEOs (SE) and the ICT coordinators in the State have visited the schools during the month. Though some of the districts visited lesser number of schools particularly in Mohali. DEO informed that he was on leave due to some fracture and hence he could visit the schools. The reports received from the ICT coordinators on visiting of the schools were examined by the head office. Following observations were made:

- i. Records are not properly maintained;
- ii. Whitewash is required in labs;
- iii. Earthing kits are not properly maintained;
- iv. Cleanliness is required in labs;
- v. Computer related displayed in the labs;
- vi. Internet connection is not functional and no remedial action is taken by schools;
- vii. Stock registers are not maintained properly;
- viii. Some computers are not functional and the schools are not reporting the same to the ICT coordinators and the vendors;

It was decided that DEOs may look into these matters and issue directions to the schools to take remedial measures. It was also decided in the meeting that the funds may be released in the head office to make the payment of the internet connections for the schools without any delay

4.2 Problems relating to the Hardware (HCL):

(i) Districts of Bathinda (1), Mansa (6) and Patiala (1) have problem each relating to UPS; districts of Mohali (1) has problem relating to Voltage Stabilizers; district of Moga (1) has problem relating to servers and desktops;

(ii) HCL informed in the meeting that some of these problems have already been rectified. However, the same was not confirmed by the district coordinator or DEO (SE). HCL was advised to send the confirmation to the district coordinators also;

4.3 Problems relating to the Hardware (GCL):

i. District of Bathinda (1) and Mansa (2) has the problem relating to UPS, districts of Bathinda (2), Faridkot (3), Ferozepur (7), Moga (1), Muktsar (1) and Sangrur (1) have the problems relating to server; districts of Bathinda (1), Ferozepur (1) and Muktsar (1) have the problems relating to printers and districts of Bathinda (1) and Muktsar (2) has the problems relating to LAN;

4.4 Theft Cases and replacement of the Hardware (HCL)

i. It was noted that HCL need to replace equipments in district Ludhiana (2) and Patiala (1) where replacement is required to be made on account of theft.

4.5 Theft Cases and replacement of the Hardware (GCL)

i. It was noted that GCL is required to replace equipments in the district Fatehgarh Sahib (1), Patiala (1) and Sangrur (1) where replacement is required to be made on account of theft.

4.6 Payment of Computer Fees:

i. It was noted that Rs. 0.51 lakhs in Hoshiarpur, Rs. 20.37 lakhs in Jalandhar, Rs. 2.56 lakhs in Kapurthala, Rs. 1.56 lakhs in Mansa, Rs. 5.3 lakhs in Nawanshaher, 0.16 lakhs in Ropar and Rs. 13.79 lakhs in Sangrur are pending towards the computer fee which needs to be deposited in the Head Office without any further delay. All DEOs (SE) are advised to ensure that this money collected as computer fee from the students are to be deposited in the Head Office without any delay as PICTES is finding difficulty in payment of the salary to the Computer teachers;

ii. It was noted that the new performa to collect the information regarding the computer fee was circulated during the last meeting. However, the DEOs have not supplied the information in its new performa. All of them were requested to do the needful.

4.7 Purchase of GEN Sets:

The issue was discussed in detail with the DEOs. The list of the schools who have adequate funds but have yet not purchased the gen sets despite issuing guidelines by the Government are as follows:

DEOs were advised to procure gensets as per the rules and procedures for schools who have got adequate funds. The matter may be examined on file in the head office in respect of the schools who are not having adequate funds.

4.8 Additional Labs or Computer required due to increase in enrollment:

The requisite information has been received from the districts. It was informed that 32 Additional Labs required 32 servers, 258 desktops, 32 printers, 87 UPS and 87 voltage stabilizers are required in various districts. DM (ICT) was advised to take further necessary action into this matter.

4.9 Internet Connectivity:

i. It was noted that the necessary information on the complaints on internet connectivity are not being collected on daily basis at present. It was decided that it should be started now once again and further necessary action may be taken to redress such complaints;

ii. It was noted that the evaluation report has been received from Hoshiarpur and Nawanshaheer from AIFT. However decision is yet to be taken by the State Government to identify more districts and give it to the vendors other than BSNL so as to have better service. DM ICT informed that the matter is pending with the Government. He was advised to follow up the matter and get it decided as early as possible.

4.10 Surprise checking of the schools:

It was informed by ASPD (Coordination) that the districts of DEOs of the districts of Jalandhar and Mohali have not sent their inspection reports to the

Head Office during December, 2008. It was decided that the DEOs who have not been sending the inspection reports regularly may be asked to explain the reasons by head office. A list of such cases shall also be maintained where disciplinary action in the Head Office is required to be taken by Section Officer and ASPD Coordination.

4.11 Vacancy of Computer teachers in the districts:

It was informed that in the districts of Amritsar (1), Barnala (27), Bathinda (1), Faridkot (19), Fatehgarh Sahib (17), Ferozepur (23), Gurdaspur (2), Hoshiarpur (18), Jalandhar (70), Kapurthala (38), Ludhiana (57), Mansa (42), Moga (119), Muktsar (20), Mohali (19), Nawanshaher (77), Patiala (93), Ropar (65), Sangrur (80) and Tarn Taran (14) have the vacancies in the respective districts. ASPD (ICT) was advised to take further necessary action as per the rules and ensure that the vacancies are filled up.

4.12 Supply of Textbooks (Computer):

It was informed in the meeting that the books have been provided by Punjab School Education Board in all the districts and the same have been distributed to the schools except classes 9th and 11th. DM ICT informed that the orders placed to Punjab School Education Department who has assured that these books shall reach to the districts within a week now;

4.13 It was noted that under the ICT project, there is dire need to maintain the quality of Education. It was noted that DM (ICT) in consultation with AM (SW) and AIFT has circulated the bare minimum standards like typing speed etc which are to be obtained by the students. It was decided that the matter may be followed up by the DEOs by writing and issuing reminders by head office also. It was also decided that the Project Manager AIFT may be requested to conduct surprise check and may report as to whether the standards prescribed by head office are being obtained in the schools or not.

4.14 Action on the following issues is to be taken by Head Office;

- i.** TA / DA is not being paid to the computer teacher who have undergone training under the Teacher Training programme of SSA;
- ii.** District Jalandhar (Accountant), Bathinda (Data Entry Operator), Ropar (Accountant), Barnala (Accountant), Moga (Accountant and Data Entry Operator), Faridkot (Data Entry Operator), Hoshiarpur (Accountant and ICT Coordinator), Nawanshaher (Accountant), Sangrur (Data Entry Operator), Barnala (Accountant and Data Entry Operator), Tarn Taran (Data Entry Operator) and Fatehgarh Sahib (Accountant) have vacancies. It was decided that AM (Admn) may expedite the necessary recruitment of these posts without any further delay;
- iii.** Districts of Ropar, Mohali, Hoshiarpur, Ferozepur, Hoshiarpur,, Kapurthala, Sangrur, Tarn Taran Barnala, Amritsar and Moga requested for one Photostat machine where the districts of Jalandhar, Mansa, Mohali, Hoshiarpur, Moga, Kapurthala, Bathinda

and Ropar requested for a fax machine. It was decided that ASPD (Proc.) may initiate further necessary action into this matter and submit a compliance report in this regard;

5.0 Mid Day Meal Scheme:

All DEOs (SE) were informed in the meeting that the State Government / Central Government has taken a decision to implement the Mid Day Meal scheme in the Upper Primary schools also i.e. the students in the classes 6th to 8th in all Government, Government Aided / Private Schools, EGS & AIE centres w.e.f. 1st July, 2008. Necessary arrangements for this shall be made by DEOs (SE) and DCs concerned. All DEOs (SE) were advised to provide all necessary help and information of DEOs (EE) and ensure that MDM is served in all the Upper Primary schools in their respective districts. On the availability of the funds it was informed in the meeting that the funds have already reached the DEOs (EE). These funds may be got released from DEOs (EE) as per the standard procedure followed earlier i.e. 3rd party checks in the name of the incharge of the Upper Primary Schools / High Schools / Senior Secondary Schools etc. Instructions in this regard have already been issued by the head office.

It was further noted that the DEOs (SE) do not extend due cooperation to DEOs (EE) as pointed out by the DEOs (EE) in the monthly meetings. It was further decided that a fortnightly meeting shall be held at the level of DEOs (EE) in which DEO (SE) or his representative shall invariably be present. Disciplinary action shall be initiated against the incharges of Upper Primary Schools who are still reluctant to implement the MDM scheme in respective of DEOs (SE).

It was further decided that the DEO Ferozpur and Tarn Taran need to pay special attention as the Mid Day Meal is being served through NGOs in the district.

6.0 EDUSAT Project:

6.1 The implementation of the Edusat project was reviewed in detail. It was noted that a large number of complaints are pending in the districts and thus there is a little impact of the programme despite the fact that sufficient funds have been made available to the Society. GM (Tech.) informed that there are 76 complaints as on date on which 52 complaints are pending for the want of consumables including batteries. It was decided that GM (Tech.) may follow the procurement of batteries and other consumables as discussed in the meeting. He was also advised to take up the matter with the highest authorities in the ISRO directing HCIL to maintain Punjab network.

6.2 Similarly, it was noted that 6 complaints relating to technical problems are pending for redressal in all the SITS installed in the Department of Higher Education.

6.3 In case of some of SITs, it has been noted that the concerned school incharges do not take interest and as a result the SITs are not put ON by such schools. This was viewed as serious. All DEOs were advised to ensure that

the SITs are put ON as per the time table circulated to the schools. In case it is found that the SITs have not been put ON without any cause or reason, the responsibility shall be fixed and the school incharges and the DEOs shall be held accountable;

6.4 The position of the SITs which requires shifting was reviewed. It was noted that 3 SITs in district 1 SIT in Faridkot, 1 in Gurdaspur, 1 in Moga, 1 in Sangrur and 3 SIT in Hoshiarpur have still not been shifted. GM (Tech.) was asked to look into this matter and take up the matter with ISRO;

6.5 It was noted that earthing in the schools to install and run equipments has not been completed in 1 school of district Barnala, 3 in Moga, 1 in Sangrur, 1 in Tarn Taran and 1 in Gurdaspur. **All DEOs of these districts were advised to do the needful and give a certificate by the next meeting that the earthing has been completed.**

6.6 The Edusat classrooms in 4 schools in district Mansa, 3 in district Moga, 6 in district SAS Nagar and 1 in district Sangrur are yet to be prepared by DEOs. DEOs in these districts were asked to get this work completed by the next meeting.

6.7 GM (Tech.) informed that 252 officials have been trained to handle the SIT equipments in various districts. He was further advised to review the position once again and submit a detailed report as to whether the employees at all the places where SITs have been installed or likely to be installed have been trained or not. He was also advised to train the officers where ROT are to be installed.

6.8 It was informed in the meeting by ASPD (Edusat) that 4661 students in medical and non medical streams stands registered in various districts for the "crash course". He was further advised to take necessary action so that the "crash course" can be started around 15.03.2009. Detailed advertisement / publicity campaign may also be launched before this course is started.

6.9 GM (Tech.) informed that out of 380 gen sets, only 303 gen sets have actually been supplied to the schools and have been made operational leaving a balance of 77 gen sets. GM (Tech.) was advised to ensure that the remaining gen sets are delivered and installed in the schools as per the schedule. Under no circumstances, the GM (Tech.) should leave this task to any other officer.

6.10 It was noted that district Barnala (2), Bathinda (9), Faridkot (2), Ferozepur (5), Fatehgarh Sahib (2), Gurdaspur (5), Jalandhar (6), Hoshiarpur (5), Ludhiana (4), Mansa (5), Moga (10), Muktsar (3), SAS Nagar (1), Sangrur (1) and Nawanshaher (14) have non functional SITs. It was further noted that there is very poor monitoring on the part of the head office and perhaps due attention needs to be paid in improving the functioning of these non functional SITs. GM (Tech) was advised to examine the issue in detail and put up the proposal within a week and ensure that the remedial measures are taken without any further delay.

6.11 It was decided that the matter of procurement of the ROTs

and SITs need to be expedited. Similarly, studio equipments may also be procured expeditiously so as to improve the quality of the reception.

7.0 Science and Maths Education:

DEOs (SE) were advised to carry out following activities to improve the standards of teaching of Maths and Science in Schools:

7.1 All DEOs (SE) were advised to ensure that Science Supervisors posted in their districts may not be given any other task like attending the meetings for the issues not connected with the improvement of the Science and Maths in the schools;

7.2 It was noted that all the District Science Supervisors have sent their reports. ASPD (MC) was advised to examine these reports and taken further necessary action. All DEOs were also advised that they should taken follow up action on the reports submitted by Science Supervisors. No lenient view may be taken in such cases where teachers have repeatedly been ignoring the directions given by Science Supervisors or DEOs or Head office particularly on the issues of non conducting of the tests regularly; checking of the copies of the students sincerely and the non completion of the syllabus in time;

7.3 It was noted that the District Science Supervisors of districts Amritsar (30), Barnala (28), Bathinda (30), Faridkot (28), Gurdaspur (16), Mohali (27), Kapurthala (23) Tarn Taran (26), Moga (27), Muktsar (25), Mansa (26), Jalandhar (24), Ludhiana (30), Hoshiarpur (24), Ferozepur (28), Nawanshaher (30), Patiala (30), Sangrur (33), Ropar (26), Fatehgarh Sahib (29) do not achieve the target of inspecting 30 schools in a particular month. They were advised to achieve these targets in the coming months also. It was further noted that the references have been made from the head office to the DEOs (SE) to take further follow up action on the reports of District Science Supervisors, however the compliance in this regard has been very poor. DEOs (SE) were requested and advised once again to give due importance to this issue and take further necessary action.

7.4 Maths labs / kits need to be provided in all the districts under SSA programme. The funds have already been received in the Head Office for the purpose. ASPD (MC) was advised to finalize the tendering process and do the needful;

7.5 It was informed that District Science Supervisors of district Faridkot, Tarn Taran, Ludhiana and Ropar have finalized the instruction booklet for activities to be taken in Maths Lab. It was decided that the further necessary action may be taken by ASPD (Math);

7.6 It was noted that the diaries are not being maintained by teachers in the schools. All DEOs (SE) were advised to issue instructions and ensure that the diaries are maintained by all the school teachers;

7.7 Regular tests of students need to be conducted in the classroom itself atleast once in a month. Results of these tests may be collected by District Science Supervisor and the same may thereafter be examined in Head Office for

taking further necessary action. It was further decided that a single question paper may be got prepared and be circulated to all the District Science Supervisors to further circulate it to the schools in Maths and Science for the class 6th to 8th. The necessary action in this regard may be expedited;

7.8 It was noted that the competitive examination for Maths and Science for class 8th and only Maths for class 6th was held on 10.01.2009. It was decided that the result may be declared by 20.01.2009 and the further necessary action may thereafter be taken so as to finalize the 1st, 2nd and 3rd position for the State level also. Necessary action in this regard may be taken by ASPD (MC), Science Supervisors and the DEOs.

7.9 It was decided in the last meeting that names of the great Mathematician and Scientist from India and abroad be written on the walls in schools to motivate the students to learn Science and Maths. **A list of such Mathematician and Scientists along with the brief description about their work is prepared in the Head Office by Maths Cell.** However it was noted that the DEOs have not sent the compliance report. In this regard they were advised to do the needful and send a report to this office without any further delay;

7.10 All DEOs (SE) /District Science Supervisors were advised to identify the list of three students from every school who are intelligent in Math and Science and thereafter arrange exposure visits to the places like Science City Kapurthala or elsewhere for these students. However no such compliance report has been received in the districts. DEOS were advised once again to send a compliance report now;

7.11 A set of questions has been prepared by District Science Supervisor Mohali which can be used for holding quizzes or otherwise all over the State. ASPD (Maths) was asked to take further necessary action in this regard;

7.12 It was informed that the hard topics in Maths and Science have been identified by Mr. Pradeep Kumar, Science Supervisor, Ludhiana and Mr. Lokesh, Science Supervisor, Ropar respectively. A specific training need to be organized during Teacher Training Programmes on these subjects thereafter.

8.0 Inspection by the Divisional Teams and the District Level Teams:

8.1 It was noted that with the approval of the State Government, Divisional Teams have been identified to inspect the schools both surprisingly as well as by giving due notice i.e. regular inspections. The inspection reports submitted by Divisional Teams of Faridkot and Jalandhar were reviewed whereas team from Patiala (Nabha) was not present. The matter was discussed in detail and it was noted that the inspections need to be strengthened a little more emphasizing on the quality education. The team was advised to concentrate on the issues regarding completion of the labs, checking of the copies, checking of the diaries of the teachers, the class room transaction process, apprehension of the subjects by the students, conduction a short test of the students etc. The team is also supposed to point out the specific details of the teachers who have done exceptional work and the teachers whose performance is poor. Disciplinary action

may also be taken against the teachers who have not performed well. Further it was also decided that the surprise inspections are very important and a report in this regard may be sent to the head office immediately in case if some teacher is found absent and is not taking any class so that necessary action can be initiated in the head office immediately;

8.2 ASPD Coordination was advised to strengthen the cell in the head office also. The reports sent by DEOs / CEOs i.e. Divisional Inspection Teams be examined in detail and it was also be ensured that follow up action may be taken on the recommendations sent by Divisional teams;

8.3 Regarding providing necessary infrastructure on the issues relating to the TA/DA of the Divisional Inspection Teams, it was decided that matter may immediately be sorted out by head office by ASPD (Coordination) and ensure that necessary action is taken now without any delay as per the discussions held in the meeting.

9.0 Miscellaneous Issues:

9.1 On the issues of pendency of GPF cases, the cases of ACP (4-9-14 cases), completion of ACRs, pension cases, the position was reviewed in the meeting itself and the position emerged as per the details given in Annexure 'B' to these minutes;

9.2 It was informed by ASPD (Ped.) that Remedial Coaching is being undertaken under SSA for all the classes from **VI to VIII** and due cooperation is not being received from DEOs (SE). All DEOs (SE) were advised to get in touch with DEOs (EE) and ensure that the Remedial Coaching is implemented in all the schools. In case, some more funds are required a proposal may be sent to Head Office without any delay;

9.3 It was noted that the Working Group constituted by the State Government has recommended that the powers to take disciplinary action against the teachers in master cadre should be delegated to DEO (SE) so as to enforce the discipline in the schools. **Head Office may initiate necessary action in this regard and take up the matter with the Government;**

9.4 It was informed in the meeting that despite the Government having issued the detailed instructions on the rationalization of the posts, the needful has still not been done by some of the DEOs. After having detailed discussions it was decided that the requisite information may be sent by all the DEOs to this office also so that the Honorable Education Minister can be apprised.

9.5 Serious concern was expressed on posting of the vocational teachers particularly on the computers. It was noted that in some of the places where there are no students still vocational teachers have been posted.

9.6 All DEOs were briefly apprised about the 5th class examination which need to be conducted by the Department of School Education this time. The examination shall be conducted in over all leadership and over all control of DEOs (SE). Respective DEOs (EE) and other officers shall assist him. All DEOs were requested and advised to ensure that no copying shall take place in these

examinations.

10.0 National Means cum Merit Scholarship:

The issue was discussed in the meeting. It was informed by the Director SCERT that the examination from the National Mean cum Merit scholarship has been conducted in the State twice during the current year i.e. 2007-08 and 2008-09. The requisite information has been collected from the districts and the same has been sent to Government of India. Representative of Director SCERT further informed that 1926 cases have been forwarded to Government of India in the Ministry of Human Resource Development. It was decided that the matter may be pursued from Director SCERT / Government of India and further necessary action may be taken.

10.1 Minority Scholarship:

It was informed by DEOs that requisite information has been sent to the Department of Welfare. Dy. SPD (A) has been advised to hold a meeting with the Director, Department of Welfare and take further necessary action.

10.2 It was informed by all the DEOs that necessary training on Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA) have already been provided to all the school heads. Further a DCF were also circulated to all the concerned schools and the same has been collected also. Necessary data entry of all the information so collected has been completed by the districts. It was decided that the head office may examine the matter on file and seek necessary advice from Government of India to generate reports and thereafter send a proposal to Government of India seeking funds for Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan. On registration of the Society, it was informed by Dy.SP.D (S) that the process has been initiated though the Society is yet to be registered.

11.0 Plantation of Trees: It was informed by DEOs that tree plantation has taken place as per the number mentioned against their names during the current year 21250 plants in Amritsar, 8500 plants in Barnala, 27710 plants in Bathinda, 8420 plants in Faridkot, 17897 plants in Fatehgarh Sahib, 17533 plants in Ferozepur, 25573 plants in Gurdaspur, 22800 plants in Hoshiarpur, 43991 plants in Jalandhar, 9500 plants in Kapurthala, 6040 plants in Ludhiana, 8375 plants in Mansa, 12000 plants in Moga, 20000 plants in Mohali, 25000 plants in Muktsar, 15000 plants in Nawanshaher, 13000 plants in Patiala, 5086 plants in Ropar, 16269 plants in Sangrur and 7650 plants in Tarn Taran It was decided that the DEOs shall randomly check on their own regarding these plantations and send a report in this regard by the next meeting.

12.0 Incentives to Girls Education:

It was informed in the meeting that Government of India has recently launched a scheme giving incentives to girls belonging to SC / ST categories and the girls passing out of KGBVs. For the purpose, it has been required by Government of India that the girls should have an account opened in the nearest branch of State Bank of India. In this regard the DEOs have already identified details of such girls which have already been received in the head office. However

only the bank accounts are yet to be opened. The representative from the State Bank of India were also present in the meeting and it was also decided that the DEO shall identify certain schools making it easier for the girls to come at those places and fill up the forms. In this purpose the DEO shall identify sufficient number of liaison officers in their districts who shall further keep liaison with SBI officials at the district level. Mr. Khanna from SBI was also present in the meeting, he told that necessary guidelines may be issued by bank also. The telephone number of Mr. Varinder Khanna 99149-80964 was circulated in the meeting. DEOs were advised to get in touch with Mr. Khanna for any problem and complete the task. It was decided that the bank account shall be opened within 15 days and thereafter the necessary information shall be sent to this office by DEOs for onwards transaction to Government of India.

13.0 The Department of Food and Civil Supplies had sent a reference to open a Consumer Club. It is reported that districts of Amritsar, Gurdaspur, Bathinda, Faridkot, Jalandhar, Ludhiana, Patiala and SAS Nagar has not sent the requisite information to the Department as yet. They are advised to do the needful.
