Invitation of Bids

1.1 Introduction

SSA Punjab is introducing Computer Aided Learning (CAL) for classes 6th to 8th in all Government Schools of Punjab. All these Schools have the adequate Information Technology (IT) Infrastructure such as follows:-

- Servers.
- Desktop Computers.
- Dot Matrix Printers.
- Voltage Stablizers (2KVA, 4 KVA, 5 KVA)
- Un-interrupted Power Systems (UPSs) with battery backup upto 150 minutes (1 KVA, 2KVA, 3 KVA)

1.2 Objectives

The main objective of the CAL project is to attract the children, retain them in schools and also to improve the quality of the education through multimedia based educational content. CAL objective is sought to be achieved through the use of multimedia educational content having features such as story based animated cartoons, games and riddles etc. Spontaneous, self initiated and self regulated - the three critical aspects that make an activity a play, are intented to be integrated in CAL software through innovative use of cartoons, story lines, music etc, to make learning an interesting experience.

1.3 Invitation of Tender.

- Mathematics
- English
- Science
- Social Science

At any time prior to the deadline for submission of bids, PROJECT DIRECTOR-CUM-DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society reserves the right to add / modify / delete any portion of this document by issuance of an addendum, which would be uploaded on the web site and will also be made available to the all the bidders who have indicated their intention to bid. The addendum shall be binding on all bidders.

PRE-QUALIFICATION CRITERIA

Considering the requirements under Computer Aided Learning (CAL) project, the following criteria are prescribed as pre-qualification criteria for SOLUTION PROVIDERS (afterwards referred as Bidder) interested in undertaking the project.

- 2.1. The Bidder should have submit Rs. 1000/- (Rupees One Thousand Only) towards the cost of the Tender Document.
- 2.2. The Bidder should have furnished the Earnest Money Deposit (EMD) of Rs. 5,00,000 (Rupees Five Lac) only.
- 2.3. The Bidder should be a reputed National/International level Education & Training company in the business of development of multimedia educational contents for the last FIVE years as on 31.12.09 in India.
- 2.4. No Consortium bidding is allowed for applications development.
- 2.5. The bidder must possess ISO 9001:2000 or SEI-CMM Level 4 or above Certification or more, at least one year prior to the date of publication of this TENDER.
- 2.6. The bidder must have minimum average per year turnover of Rs. 3.00 Crores (Rupees Three Crores) from content development for the preceding 3 financial years ended with 31st March 2009 and supply a certificate from Chartered Accountant in this regard. The bidder also have to submit copies of balance sheets /profit & loss accounts/ annual reports of last three financial years (upto 31-Mar-2009).
- 2.7. The bidder must have developed at least 100 multimedia based Computer Aided Learning (CAL) content in at least one regional language (including English for limited purposes) for one or more States. Bidder has to provide details of all such projects and reference details in General bid. Copies of work orders and successful completion / implementation certificates of each such project should be enclosed with the bid.
- 2.8. The bidder must have well-established and proven methodology of conducting teacher training and should have trained at least 500 school teachers in the last three years. The profile of trainers along with No. of trainees trained to be provided
- 2.9. The bidder should have technically qualified software workforce of atleast 50 persons as on 31-01-2010 on its payroll, involved in content development.

- 2.10. The bidders must submit an undertaking that the client's will have the Intellectual Proprietary Rights (IPR) & Source Code of the solution / product/ solution, so developed, within framework being offered under this TENDER.
- 2.11. Documentary proof of at least two years experience and competency to prepare Graphics and Animation based learning material for computers and other subjects be provided.

Note

- The PROJECT DIRECTOR-CUM-DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society, if required, would visit/ make enquiries about the sites mentioned by the bidder under 'Relevant Experience' to verify the level of multimedia content development infrastructure, assess long term sustainability and other aspects related to the project.
- Bidder should not be under a declaration of ineligibility for corrupt and fraudulent, practices issued by Govt. of India/State Govts. A self-declaration certificate should be submitted as part of Pre-qualification bid.
- PROJECT DIRECTOR-CUM-DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society reserves the right to accept or reject any or all responses without assigning any reason.

Only successful pre-qualifiers will be called for opening of technical bids.

SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of the work includes the following three components:

- (a) Develop Multimedia Educational Content for Computer Based Education in Science, Social Science, Mathematics and English for class 6 to 8 based on Punjab State Syllabus, using Punjabi language.
- (b) Supply and install above Multimedia Educational Content in all schools (approximately 5250 schools). The number of schools can increase/ decrease.
- (c) Provide training on the Multimedia Educational Content to minimum 4 teachers of each school one teacher of each subject).

3.1 Multimedia Based Educational Content.

The bidder shall develop the multimedia educational content for the hard spots in the subjects of Science, Social Science, mathematics and English for classes 6 to 8 based on syllabus of State of Punjab for Government schools in Punjabi language. The related activities include:-

- Understanding the requirement for developing and installation of customized CAL product. Suggestive list of hard-spots is enclosed as per Annexure '11' with the tender document.
- Conceptualizing the multimedia content based on story lines, animated cartoons, interactive games, live coverage, music and riddles.
- Planning in detail, the content development during Pre-production, Production and Post-production stages.
- Development of content with full multimedia quality control.
- Supply of CAL product on DVD media (Two sets to each school and One set to head office).
- Supply of Installation Manual, Administration Manual and User Reference/Training Manual.
- Provide post installation/implementation support including bugs removal. Maintain help-desk and handholding for the system.
- In case additional requirement arises for developing multimedia content for subject(s) other than the above given list, , the bidder will be asked to undertake the same on pro-rata cost basis.

The installation of the product will require extensive interaction of the bidder with School(s), their staff and the Turnkey Hardware & Service Providers (THSPs) at various stages of the project.

Important Note

- The bidder is required to arrange a copy of Subject Textbooks prescribed by the Punjab School Education Board (PSEB), Mohali under own arrangements and consult these books before quoting for multi-media Content.
- Topics/ hard-spots in the said subjects for developing Multimedia based educational content, will be identified/ decided by the subject experts of the Bidder in consultation the experts committee (a single nodal agency for consultation, evaluation and approval of content) nominated by the PROJECT DIRECTOR-CUM-DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society, Punjab
- 3.1.1 Required features of the CAL Software keeping in mind the aptitude and ability of the children (including questions and answers) It should also have interactive virtual labs especially in math and science. :-
 - <u>User Interface:</u> The proposed system components should be simple comprehensive, learner centric and easy to use.
 - <u>GUI:</u> The proposed solution should be based on graphical interpretation and windows architecture.
 - <u>Local language:</u> For better understanding and interpretation, the Punjabi language in the multimedia content will be written and spoken with utmost correctness. The Punjabi experts may be engaged for the purpose.
 - <u>Cultural Context of Multimedia Content:</u> It should predominantly reflect life ethos and culture of Punjab.

3.1.2 Implementation

For a smooth roll out of CAL Software in Schools, a phase-wise implementation schedule as under will be adhered to:-

• Pilot Phase (6 months) comprises of design and development, validation of multimedia content for all given subjects and classes, and its approval by the PROJECT DIRECTOR-CUM-DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society. Installation and implementation of CAL software in all Schools of two Districts (Patiala and Fatehgarh Sahib) as a pilot project basis.

• **Replication Phase (4 months)** comprises of deployment of finally accepted CAL software in remaining Schools. The software developer would provide necessary technical instructions to to facilitate installation of multimedia content.

3.1.3 Period of Support

The bidder will be responsible for the installation /implementation of the CAL software and its subsequent maintenance and handholding for a period of 3 years from the date of acceptance of the Project. It shall be renewable on mutual consent.

The period of contract shall commence from the date of execution of the agreement.

3.1.4 Instructions

- a) Concepts should be explained through good and effective graphics, and animations based on imaginative analogies and examples locally available, commonly noticed by the children in real life. Instruction manuals must be supplied along with developed software.
 - (i) Time duration of every topic should ideally be 22 to 30 minutes.
 - (ii) The animation in every topic should minimum be of 3-5 minutes.
 - (iii) Animation should be a mixture of 2D/3D. The minimum time frame for 3D animations should be 30 second.
 - (iv) The quality of voice over should be good, clear and audible and there may preferably in the ratio 50:50 between male and female voice.
 - (v) Any topic having more than one character should have different voices for different characters. It should be a min. of male and female voice
- b) Subject teachers/experts committee nominated by the Project Director cum DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society shall review and monitor the content developed by the bidder in each subject. The final approval to the content shall be given by PROJECT DIRECTOR CUM DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society.
- c) The Multimedia based Education Content is presently being developed for Class 6 to 8 for four subjects. If the syllabus gets revised by the Govt. of Punjab, the bidder will have to update the content without any extra cost.
- d) Quality Assurance benchmarks and processes will be deployed as per best prevalent practices in the country.
- e) The bidder should ensure proper installation of the Educational Content in the Computer system at all schools and their proper functioning; the respective District Education Officers and the Head of the school of the concerned school will certify the successful installation. The installation of educational software shall be done at the risk and cost of the bidder.

- f) If any manufacturing or other technical defects are found in the Educational Content within one year from the time of installation, the same will have to be rectified free of cost by the bidder.
- g) The content developed will be the property of Punjab Edusat Society and it can be used by Punjab Edusat Society in any school in State of Punjab.

3.2 Completeness of tender offer

The Bidder is expected to examine all instructions, forms, terms, conditions and deliverables in the Tender Documents. Failure to furnish all information required by the tender documents or submission of a tender offer not substantially responsive in every respect to the tender documents will be at the Bidder 's risk and may result in rejection of its tender offer. The tender offer is liable to be rejected outright without any intimation to the Bidder if complete information as called for in the tender document is not given therein, or if particulars asked for in the Forms / Performa in the tender are not fully furnished.

3.3 Training of Subject Teachers

The bidder will train minimum 4 teachers from each school on usage and integration of multimedia educational content in the lesson plans. The TA/DA shall be paid by the Punjab Edusat Society. Due attention should be given to the following aspects:-

- i) Proper curriculum for the training should be designed and be approved by the PROJECT DIRECTOR-CUM-DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society.
- ii) The training should be for 2 working days for basic of computers and 5 days for usages of Multimedia content. Every year a refresher training for 2 days will also be conducted. The training programs shall be conducted in the District Institutes of Education and Training and Govt. In-service Training Centres. The batch of training shall consist of 30 40 teachers.
- iii) There should be special emphasis on practical training (operating computers for the use of lesson plans).
- iv) The venue and infrastructure for the training will be provided by the PROJECT DIRECTOR-CUM-DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society.

v) Each school will be provided with a reference manual for each subject. The reference manual should contain detailed documentation of the educational content and its integration in the lesson plans.

3.4 **Operational Scope of the Contract:**

- a) The Client will appoint a **Technical Advisory Panel**, which will oversee production, supply and installation of the Educational Content under this contract. The Bidder will have to work under close technical supervision and guidance of the Technical Advisory Panel appointed by the PES. The decision of the Technical Advisory Panel with respect to the adherence to the technical parameters and implementation schedule given of the bidder; and on the quality standards of the product developed and their applicability at the target schools will be final.
- b) The **Technical Advisory Panel** appointed by the PES will have full powers to visit the premises of the bidder at any stage of development of software.
- c) The Bidder shall associate minimum one Subject Expert for each of the subjects nominated by PES during every stage of development of the Educational Content till the final approval by the Technical Advisory Panel is obtained.
- d) The bidder shall use only licensed versions of the system/Application software and shall be held liable for any consequent action arising out of patent/intellectual property right violations and the PES shall not be responsible for any liabilities or damages arising thereof.
- e) The development work for the Multimedia Based Educational Content should be undertaken in the premises of the successful Bidder. The development work should ideally be carried out within Punjab but this is not mandatory. In case, the development and production of the Educational Content is carried out from a place outside of the State of Punjab, the Bidder will be required to establish a Project Coordination Unit at Chandigarh vested with adequate decision-making authority w.r.t. day-to-day coordination with the Technical Advisory Panel of the PES. Any advice of the Technical Advisory Panel will have to be responded within a period of 3 (three) working days.
- f) The Intellectual Proprietary Rights (IPR) of developed Multimedia Based Educational Content will vest with the PES as far as their use in government schools within the State of Punjab is concerned. The bidder will, however, have usage rights of the content outside the State of Punjab and for private educational institutions within the State, without any infringement of IPR of the client. PROJECT DIRECTOR CUM DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society shall have all rights on Software, Source Code and related documentation for its unlimited, unrestricted use within the State of Punjab at unlimited number of locations, machines, computers, gadgets etc.. However, PROJECT DIRECTOR CUM DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society shall not allow its use to any other State Government for commercial or non-commercial purposes.
- g) The total number of teachers to be trained for each district will be decided by Client. This may include additional teachers from the same or other schools that may be deputed by Punjab Edusat Society.

INSTRUCTION TO BIDDERS

4.1. General information

- 4.1.1. There are THREE parts of Tender Document namely: (two sets in each part—Original bid and First Copy):-
 - <u>First part:</u> "Selection of Solution Provider for Computer Aided Learning (CAL) Software" **Prequalification Bid.**
 - <u>Second part</u>: "Selection of Solution Provider for Computer Aided Learning (CAL) Software" **Technical Bid.**
 - <u>Third part:</u> "Selection of Solution Provider for Computer Aided Learning (CAL) Software" Commercial Bid.
- 4.1.2. The bidder is required to fill-out all the three parts of contract papers and place them in three separate sealed envelopes.
- 4.1.3. These envelopes should be placed in another sealed envelope and addressed to:

Project Director-cum-DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society 3rd Floor, SCO 104-106, Sector 34-A, Chandigarh.

- 4.1.4. Tenders (non-transferable) would be considered in the prescribed tender form/ document only, which can be obtained in printed form, from the O/o the tendering authority i.e. PROJECT DIRECTOR-CUM-DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society, Chandigarh during office hours of working day, on payment of document fee (non-refundable) as per the schedule. Tender, duly filled and accompanying all supporting documents, should be submitted on or before the given time after which no tenders would be accepted.
- 4.1.5. The bidders who are downloading the tender document from the website: www.ssapunjab.org must furnish the given tender fee.
- 4.1.6. The bids will be opened at the given address in the presence of representatives of the participating bidders as per the bid opening schedule mentioned earlier. The Pre-qualification Bids of only those bidders who have submitted the Tender document fees and EMD will be opened.

The Technical Bids of only the bidders short-listed from the Pre-qualification bids will be opened. Similarly, The Commercial Bids of only the bidders short-listed from the Technical bids will be opened. The bids will be opened on the scheduled date and time even in case of absence of the tenderers.

- 4.1.7. Tenders shall be submitted fully in accordance with the requirements of the General Terms and Conditions. Appropriate forms prescribed with this document shall be used for filling quotations. Incomplete, illegible and unsealed tenders will be rejected. Telegraphic tenders will not be accepted and no correspondence will be made in this regard.
- 4.1.8. All offers should be made in English. Conditional offers and offers qualified by vague and indefinite expressions such as "Subject to immediate acceptance", "Subject to prior sale" etc. will not be considered.
- 4.1.9. The price and conditions of the offer should be valid for at least a period of 180 days from the date of tender opening. Tender with validity of less than 180 days will be rejected.
- 4.1.10. Modification of specifications and extension of closing date of tender if required will be made by an Addendum. Copies of Addenda will be notified on the website. These shall be signed and shall form a part of the tender in full and/or part thereof.
- The bidder shall carefully examine the tender documents and the technical 4.1.11. specifications and fully acquaint themselves as to all the conditions and matters, affect which may in any way, the work or the cost thereof. Should a tenderer find discrepancies in or omissions from the specifications or other documents, or should there be any doubt as to their meaning, he should at once notify PROJECT DIRECTOR-CUM-DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society and obtain clarification in writing. This however does not entitle the tenderer to ask for time beyond the due date fixed for receipt of tenders.
- 4.1.12. Submitted tender forms, with overwritten or erased or illegible rate or rates not shown in figures and words in English, will be liable for rejection. In case of discrepancy between words and figures noted against each item of the tender and between unit rates and the total amount, the decision of the tendering authority will be final and binding on the tenderers. Total of each item and grand total of whole tender should be clearly written. Corrections in the tender, if unavoidable, should be made by rewriting with dated initial of the tenderer after scoring out of the wrong entries. Clerical and arithmetical mistakes may result in rejection of the tender.
- 4.1.13. Request from the tenderer in respect of additions, alterations, modifications, corrections etc. of either terms and conditions or rates after opening of the tender will not be considered.

- 4.1.14. While tenders are under consideration, tenderers and their representatives or other interested parties, are advised to refrain from contacting by any means tenderers' personnel or representatives, on matters relating to the tenders under study. PROJECT DIRECTOR-CUM-DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society if necessary will obtain clarification on tenders by requesting such information from any or all the tenderers either in writing or through personal contact as may be necessary. The tenderer will not be permitted to change the substance of his offer after the tenders have been received in PROJECT DIRECTOR-CUM-DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society. Any attempt by any bidder to bring pressure of any kind, may disqualify the bidder for the present tender and the bidder may be liable to be debarred from bidding for PROJECT DIRECTOR-CUM-DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society tenders in future for a period of three years.
- 4.1.15. PROJECT DIRECTOR-CUM-DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society reserves all rights to cancel the tender without assigning any reason thereof.

4.2. Cost of bidding

- 4.2.1. The Bidder shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its bid and PROJECT DIRECTOR-CUM-DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society will in no case be responsible or liable for these costs, whether or not the Bid is finally accepted.
- 4.2.2. **Non-transferable Tender:** The Tender Document is not transferable. Only the party which has purchased this tender form shall be entitled to quote.

4.3. **Proposal validity**

- 4.3.1. Technical and Financial Proposals shall remain valid for a period of 180 days from the date specified for opening of Technical Bid. PROJECT DIRECTOR CUM DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society shall reject the Proposal as being non-responsive if it is valid for a shorter period.
- 4.3.2. In exceptional circumstances, prior to expiry of the original Proposal validity period, PROJECT DIRECTOR CUM DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society may request that the Bidders extend the period of validity for a specified additional period. The request and the responses thereto shall be made in writing to or by facsimile on the listed contact information of the Bidders. In such cases, the Bidders shall not be required or permitted to modify the Proposal, but shall be required to extend the validity of the Proposal for the extension period.

4.4. **EMD**

4.4.1. The bidder shall furnish, as part of its general bid, an EMD of amount Rs. 5,00,000.00 (Rupees Five Lac only). The EMD is required to protect PROJECT

DIRECTOR CUM DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society against the risk of bidder's conduct, which would warrant the forfeiture of EMD, pursuant to clause 4.12

- 4.4.2. The EMD shall be in the form of Demand Draft from any Scheduled Bank in favour of PROJECT DIRECTOR CUM DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society, payable at Chandigarh and will not be liable for any interest.
- 4.4.3. Any bid, not containing the EMD will be rejected as non-responsive. Unsuccessful bidder's EMD will be discharged / returned as promptly as possible, but not later than 30 days after the expiration of the period of bid validity.
- 4.4.4. Any modification of the Proposal documents which may become necessary as a result of the Pre-Bid meeting shall be made by the PROJECT DIRECTOR CUM DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society exclusively through the issue of an Addendum on the web site.

4.5. **Bid Opening**

Bids can be submitted up to 19-06-2009 upto 3:00PM and it will be opened on 19-06-2009 at 4:00PM. Hours in the presence of the representatives of the bidders who wish to attend the opening of the bids. Technically qualified bids will be taken up for further processing. Financial Bids of technically qualified bidders will be opened in the presence of the bidders / representatives on a separate date and time which will be notified separately.

No discussion / interaction will be held with the bidders whose bids have been rejected / disqualified.

- 4.5.1. **The TENDER Evaluation Committee(s)**, shall evaluate the Prequalification Bids, Technical Bids and Presentations and Commercial bids. The decisions of the Evaluation Committee(s) in the evaluation of the Commercial bids shall be final. No correspondence will be entertained outside the process of negotiation / discussion with the Committee(s).
- 4.5.2. At the date, time and location of the bid opening as specified in the TENDER, the Evaluation Committee(s) shall open the Proposals, in the presence of Bidders' designated representatives who choose to attend. The Bidders' representatives who are present shall sign a register evidencing their attendance. The Bidders' names, and any such other details as the Evaluation Committee(s) may consider appropriate, will be announced by the Evaluation Committee(s) at the opening.

- 4.5.3. The Evaluation Committee(s) reserves the right at any time to postpone or cancel a scheduled bid opening. The bids will be opened at the address specified in TENDER.
- 4.5.4. The bidders qualified in Pre-qualification Bids would only be called for opening of Technical Bids and for Technical Presentation.

4.6. Source Code and IPR

.Notwithstanding anything else contained to contrary in this Tender Document, PROJECT DIRECTOR CUM DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society reserves the right to distribute the work to more than one bidder on rates of L1 bidder.

4.16. Notification of award

- 4.16.1. Prior to the expiry of the period of Bid validity, PROJECT DIRECTOR CUM DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society will notify the successful Bidder in writing by speed post or Fax or email that its Bid has been accepted.
- 4.16.2. The liability of the bidder to perform the services will commence from the date of notification of Award. The Completion Period shall be counted from the date of 'Notification of Award of Work'.

4.17. Signing of Contract

4.17.1. At the time as the Client notifies the successful bidder that its bid has been accepted, the Indenting Officer will send the bidder the Contract Form, incorporating all agreement between the parties.

The vender shall ensure due secrecy of information and data not intended for public distribution. The affidavit to this effect should be submitted along with security deposit.

4.24. Force Majeure

4.25. Arbitration

- a) All disputes, differences, claims and demands arising under the contract shall be referred to the Administrative Secretary, Govt. of Punjab, Department of School Education for final decision and the same shall be binding on all parties.
- b) Any other terms and conditions mutually agreed prior to finalization of the order / agreement shall be binding on the consultant.
- c) PROJECT DIRECTOR CUM DGSE, Punjab Edusat Society and the selected Solution Provider shall make every effort to resolve amicably through direct negotiation, any disagreement or dispute arising between them under or in connection with the work order. If any dispute arises between parties on aspects not covered by this agreement, or the construction or operation thereof, or the rights, duties or liabilities under these except as to any matter the decision of which is specially provided for by the general conditions, such disputes shall be referred to two arbitrators, one to be appointed by each party and the said
